God comes to us as a child: vulnerable, small, and human. He comes swaddled in the blanket of night, quietly, without swagger or cavalcade. He does not wish to overwhelm us by force but to love us into freedom. He will not crow bar His way into our lives. Instead, He waits for us to slip the bolts and swing open our hearts to Him. Let Him enter the King of Glory.

God has come among us and remains with us through the life of His Church, above all, in the Eucharist. God is now real and present to us in the forms of bread and wine. Hodie Christus Natus est. Christ is born this day. May He bless and protect you, your families and friends during these coming holy days. May He strengthen your hope and give you the courage to play your part in His mission of salvation. Let him enter the King of Glory.

WHEN DOES CHRISTMAS END? In our secular culture the Christmas season begins around mid-September and winds up around December 27. However, in the Church, the season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (12th January 2025). It is for this reason that the crib in the church will remain on display throughout this time.

During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts, and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him including the fact that he was born to die for us.

THE CHALKING OF THE DOORS: AN EPIPHANY TRADITION Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night or Three Kings Day) marks the occasion of this tradition. The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2025 — is simple: take a stick of chalk and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 25

What does this strange equation mean?

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi - Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar - who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin  $_4$ 

phrase, *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the Cross and the "20" at the beginning and the "25" at the end mark the year.

This equation is simply a humble request for Christ to bless our homes and that His protecting hand be over our families and friends in all the joys and challenges of the coming year.
