THE CHALKING OF THE DOORS: AN EPIPHANY TRADITION

Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night or Three Kings Day) marks the occasion of this tradition. The formula for the ritual - adapted for 2025- is simple: take a stick of chalk and write the following at the entrance to your home: 20 + C + M + B + 25

What does this strange equation mean?

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the Cross and the "20" at the beginning and the "25" at the end mark the year.

This equation is simply a humble request for Christ to bless our homes and that His protecting hand be over our families and friends in all the joys and challenges of the coming year.
